

In Biblical days kings would have their enemies slain before them. This is to set the expectation that our King's enemies will be dealt with as well.

I agree with this Pastor's thoughts on it pertaining to the Jews. As a nation they rejected Jesus and He will not return for them until they recognize Him. They can be saved right now just like we can, they have the same covenant now as we do and that covenant is to repent of their sins, believe in Jesus Christ, accept Him as their Savior, offer Him as their Sacrifice and adhere to His Word and obey Him now.

Thinking about Luke 19:27 and how in 1995, it said bring those My people, or as it now reads My enemies, bring before Me and slay them. God has been dealing with those that have rejected Christ and He will continue to do so. This next passage of Scripture shows the sacrifice that God made for us through Christ.

Zechariah 13:7-9 - Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd, and against the Man *that is* My Fellow (My Associate), saith the LORD of hosts: smite the Shepherd (strike the Shepherd), and the sheep shall be scattered: and I will turn Mine hand upon the little ones. And it shall come to pass, *that* in all the land, saith the LORD, two parts therein shall be cut off *and* die; but the third shall be left therein. And I will bring the third part through the fire, and will refine them as silver is refined, and will try them as gold is tried: they shall (will) call on My name, and I will hear them (I will answer them): I will say, It *is* My people: and they shall say (and he shall say), The LORD *is* my God.

Zechariah 13:9 - And I have brought the third into fire, And refined them like a refining of silver, And have tried them like a trying of gold, It doth call in My name, and I answer it, I have said, 'My people it is,' And it saith, 'Jehovah is my God!'

God the Father allowed Jesus to go through all of that for us. Jesus did the Father's will even though it was such a hard thing to do because He was like us in the flesh even though He was then, and is still now, fully God. Everyone deserted Him when they came out and arrested Him. Look what happened when the Romans came in and destroyed the temple and burned it down and killed two parts of the Jews in 70 AD.

Listen to this parable:

Matt.22:1-14 – And Jesus answered and spake unto them again by parables, and said, The kingdom of heaven (The Kingdom of the heavens) is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son (who made a wedding feast to the son of him), And sent forth his servants (slaves) to call them that were bidden to the wedding: and they would not come. Again, he sent forth other servants, saying, Tell them which are bidden (the (ones) called), Behold, I have prepared my dinner (Behold, I have readied my supper): my oxen and *my* fatlings (fatted beasts) *are* killed, and all things *are* ready: come unto the marriage (come to the wedding feast). But they made light of *it* (but they not caring), and went their ways, one to his farm (his own field), another to his merchandise (trading): And the remnant

took his servants, and entreated *them* spitefully (insulted them), and slew *them* (killed them). But when the king heard *thereof*, he was wroth: and he sent forth his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. Then saith he to his servants, The wedding is ready, but they which were bidden were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage (feast). So those servants went out into the highways, and gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good (both evil and good): and the wedding was furnished with guests (and the wedding was filled with recliners). And when the king came in to see the guests (those reclining), he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment: And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless. Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast *him* into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few *are* chosen.

About those “recliners.” In Biblical times it is said that when they used to have feasts they would recline or lay down. So the pictures of the “Last Supper” are not actually true to the time.

This parable shows that God first called the Jews but they made excuses and refused to come and then they even killed His servants that came to bid them. Those servants they killed were God’s prophets. Then the invitation went out to everyone. Have you received your invitation? Have you received Christ? Do you have the proper wedding garment on?

Here is another Scripture where Jesus speaks of the Jews killing God’s prophets.

Matt. 23:37-39 – O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, *thou* that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under *her* wings, and ye would not! Behold, your house is left unto you desolate. For I say unto you, Ye shall not see Me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed *is* He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The angels move at God's command, they are His servants as we are also. They will gather the tares.

Matt.13:30 - Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares (darnel), and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn (garner / YL: storehouse).

I wonder if it's force of nature? I can sort of relate. Many of my first memories are in church and learning about the Bible. I was very active in Awana and memorized verses to earn jewel badges. Never thought the reason for memorizing them was because some day they would just up and drift away. Even crazier, it was done in such a subtle way that hardly anyone noticed.

We're simply the ones who were paying attention and notice the voice of our Master and Savior, Jesus Christ of Nazareth is not the voice I am hearing today in the Bible. Jesus doesn't say "All Hail!" Jesus doesn't say hate our family. Jesus doesn't say to slay enemies of God.

He says this:

But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you,

Luke 6:27 KJV

The Scripture where Jesus says whoever doesn't hate mother, father, brother sisters etc. is not worthy of Me. That is one of the first indications I had that told me this group as a whole is not hearing God's voice. They cannot understand what Jesus meant there. That He is to be our 1st love, above everyone and everything, even our families.

Exodus 32:26-28 - Then Moses stood in the gate of the camp, and said, Who is on the LORD'S side? *let him come* unto me. And all the sons of Levi gathered themselves together unto him. And he said unto them, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Put every man his sword by his side, *and* go in and out from gate to gate throughout the camp, and slay every man his brother, and every man his companion, and every man his neighbor (and kill each one his brother, and each one his neighbor and each one his relative). And the children of Levi did according to the word of Moses: and there fell of the people that day about three thousand men.

While Moses was up on the mountain with God receiving the ten commandments, the people had made a golden calf and were worshipping it and committing sexual perversion with each other. To purge the sin out from among the people judgment was executed swiftly. They certainly did slay those who did not want to be obedient in serving God.

Look at these examples of slay/slain/slew being used in Scripture:

Psalm 89:10 – Thou hast broken Rahab in pieces, as one that is slain; Thou hast scattered Thine enemies with Thy strong arm.

Psalm 105:29 – He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.

This is talking about the great wonders that God performed in Egypt. Thinking on the word slew which is a past tense of slay, God did not behead the fish. He simply killed them.

Numbers 25:1-5 – And Israel abode in Shittim, and the people began to commit whoredom (fornicate) with the daughters of Moab. And they called the people unto the sacrifices of their gods: and the people did eat, and bowed down to their

gods. And Israel joined himself unto Baalpeor: and the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel. And the LORD said unto Moses, Take all the heads of the people (take all the chiefs of the people), and hang them up before the LORD in the sun, that the fierce anger of the LORD may be turned away from Israel. And

Moses said unto the judges of Israel, **Slay (kill)** ye everyone his men that were joined unto Baalpeor.

Leviticus 26:25 – And I will bring a sword upon you, that shall avenge the quarrel of My covenant (executing the vengeance of My covenant): and when ye are gathered together within your cities, I will send the pestilence among you; and ye shall be delivered into the hand of the enemy.

1 Sam. 10:26-27 – And Saul also went home to Gibeah; and there went with him a band of men, whose hearts God had touched. But the children of Belial said (sons of worthlessness said), How shall this man save us? And they despised him, and brought him no presents. But he held his peace.

This was right after Saul was anointed to be king over Israel. These people openly rebelled against his authority and ultimately they rebelled against God.

Saul went out to fight against Israel's enemy and won. After this fight the people said the following:

1 Sam. 11:12 – And the people said unto Samuel, Who *is* he that said, Shall Saul reign over us? bring the men, that we may put them to death.

Saul did not allow anyone to be killed. The people knew it was not right to oppose the king's ruler ship and authority. How much more worthy is Christ Jesus than even the earthly kings that have served Him?

King David cut off Goliath's head.

1 Sam. 17:51 – Therefore David ran, and stood upon the Philistine, and took his sword, and drew it out of the sheath thereof, and slew him, and cut off his head therewith. And when the Philistines saw their champion (warrior) was dead, they fled.

Joel 4:11-14 - Assemble yourselves, and come, all ye heathen (nations), and gather yourselves together round about: thither cause thy mighty ones to come down, O LORD. Let the heathen (nations) be wakened, and come up to the valley of Jehoshaphat: for there will I sit to judge all the heathen round about. Put ye in the sickle, for the harvest is ripe: come, get you down; for the press is full, the vats overflow; for their wickedness *is* great. Multitudes, multitudes in the valley of decision: for the day of the LORD *is* near in the valley of decision.

This is the timeframe of the parable of the King in Luke 19 that we have been studying.

Amos 9:1-3 - I saw the Lord standing upon (by) the altar: and He said, Smite the lintel of the door, that the posts (thresholds) may shake: and cut them in the head (break them on the head), all of them; and I will slay the last of them with the sword: he that fleeth of them shall not flee away, and he that escapeth of them shall not be delivered. Though they dig into hell (Sheol), thence (from there) shall Mine hand take them; though they climb up to heaven (the heavens), thence (from there) will I bring them down: And though they hide themselves in the top of Carmel, I will search and take them out thence; and though they be hid from My sight in the bottom of the sea, thence will I command the serpent, and he (it) shall bite them:

Who commands the serpent? Christ does. He created satan. God's judgment is just. To really know God you must be familiar with the judgment side of Him as well. He chastens the ones He loves and it isn't just a time out with your nose in the corner. He will spank you and make it clear. He will deal severely with those who have rejected His Son Jesus Christ and in so doing have rejected Him.

CLOSING

I was floored when they started trying to pick this verse apart. Finding things there that had not changed.

The OT is filled with battles and wars and fighting. Israel had a lot of fighting to do with enemies in the flesh. When Jesus came and laid His life down for us He became the New Covenant and He is the change Israel was waiting for but did not

realize it. They wanted someone to come and physically fight and set up a kingdom. For us today, we are so blessed not to have to fight the way Israel did back then. We are now told to love our enemies. Our fight is a spiritual one.

Matt.5:44 - But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you (abusing you), and persecute you;

When someone is cursing you, that is with their words. Don't think like we do today, of someone cussing you out. But think of a witch trying to cast a curse on you. You are to still use your words for good, speak kindly to them. When they are mean to you, we don't get ugly or mean back to them, tit for tat, but we remain constant in Christ and do good things in spite of their hate. In all of this, pray for them.

We as Christians don't go around picking fights or even arguing. We certainly aren't to kill anyone but we can defend our lives and the lives of those we love. As much as possible we are to walk away from arguments and fights and live at peace with all men.

COMMENTARY FROM MATTHEW HENRY ON HEB.9:28

As no wisdom, learning, virtue, wealth, or power, can keep one of the human race from death, so nothing can deliver a sinner from being condemned at the day of judgment, except the atoning sacrifice of Christ; nor will one be saved from eternal punishment who despises or neglects this great salvation.

PRAYER
