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JESUITS and the PRE-TRIBULATION RAPTURE – Pt 1: LACUNZA, IRVING, DARB...

Some say because the Catholic Church believes in the pre-trib rapture that it must be a lie. That goes along with the idea that has been planted, that the Roman Catholic Church had a Jesuit teach on the pre-trib rapture. I am one of the biggest haters of the Roman Catholic Church and have worked so hard to expose it. It is the face of the mystery Babylon Religion. Do Roman Catholics Believe in the rapture? Let's look at an excerpt from *U.S. Catholic*: This article appeared in the [August 2014](#) issue (Vol. 79, No. 8, page 46).

Strictly speaking, Catholics do believe in a form of “rapture:” a bodily assumption into heaven of all the faithful, both living and dead, at Jesus' second and final coming and judgement. This will be preceded by the appearance of the Antichrist and an associated period of intense persecution of Christians known as the tribulation.

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What is described here is a post-tribulation rapture. No millennial reign involved, we'll get to what they believe about that in a moment. There is no secrecy here, no urgency to catch away the church, no surprise like a thief in the night. Notice they are placing the second coming and judgement all together here and completely leave out the 1000 year reign of Christ on this earth. If we were to believe that theory, then why would those that are here and alive be raptured? Because at that time Jesus is sitting as Judge at the Great White Throne Judgement. And for those that believe Christians go through the tribulation, you

are in agreement with the Roman Catholic Church on that point. They are the face of Mystery Babylon.

At the [second coming of Christ](#) at the [end of time](#), all who have died will be [resurrected bodily from the dead](#) for the [Last Judgment](#), whereupon Jesus will fully establish the [Kingdom of God](#) in fulfillment of [scriptural prophecies](#).^{[138][139]}

From Wikipedia on Catholic theology: At the second coming of Christ at the end of time, all who have died will be resurrected bodily from the dead for the Last Judgment, whereupon Jesus will fully establish the Kingdom of God in fulfillment of scriptural prophecies.

Here they only mention everyone being resurrected for judgment. When they say “at the end of time” they are alluding here, that time is finished at this point. They do not believe in a literal 1000 year reign of Christ on this earth before the Great White Throne Judgment. The Roman Catholics believe in amillennialism. Meaning that they believe right now we are already in the 1000 year reign. They believe it is only a spiritual reign and that the 1000 years is just symbolic for an unspecified amount of time. The millennial reign is a reign of peace and I can assure you we are not in it already.

The Lord’s prayer begins with asking for the millennial reign to begin on this earth. Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. At no time since Jesus taught the disciples to pray that prayer, have we had 1000 years of peace on this earth. The millennial reign has not happened yet.

Here is a quote from Lacunza’s book:

Quote: “Whence it follows which is the principle matter to be attended to that there must be a very considerable space of time between the coming of the Lord which we expect and the judgment of the dead or the universal resurrection.”

Those that don’t believe in the pre-trib rapture use this quote to say he taught it in his book. What I found Lacunza to actually be dealing with here is the fact that the Roman Catholic Church does not believe in a literal, physical millennial reign after the Second Coming of Christ. That is what he is addressing here. That is why it is said that he was trembling under the walls of the Vatican when he wrote

this. Interesting to note that he being a Jesuit, was not doing a good job in holding to the RCC's teachings himself. Maybe it took some time to get the order formed more properly and under better control to spread deception. Or possibly he taught other things that were deception but I did not find a pre-trib rapture, as I understand it, to be in his book at all.

In my research they say that by the 2nd century no one was teaching or believing in a literal 1000 year reign on this earth. Or that it was not the universal belief of the church. I also learned in research that there are some that believe the tribulation already happened and that it was fulfilled in the Jewish-Roman war when the second temple was destroyed. Those that believe we are in the millennial reign right now think we are restoring peace to the world and once we have accomplished that, then Jesus will return.

from them in the Scofield Bible. They say that is how the pre-trib rapture teaching came to the U.S., through the Scofield Reference Bible.

Let me just state that I have not read that Bible. I have read the Geneva Bible that was printed in 1560 and the rapture teaching is in that Bible. It clearly was written and printed before 1833. I stick with the KJV in my daily reading and teaching and Darby had nothing to do with the translation of the KJV as per research. Apparently Darby was someone who helped to shed light on the teaching and it gained popularity through him in 1827. 1790 is when the Jesuit LaCunza printed his book which supposedly floated the idea of a pre-trib rapture. The pre-trib rapture is in the 1560 Geneva Bible and in the 1611 KJ Bible. Well before this Jesuit book, before Darby, before Irving and before Margaret MacDonald. You have to look at all of this stuff instead of just hearing something and believing it. The timeline they are pushing doesn't match up.

So you can see all these religions, including the Roman Catholic Church do not believe in a pre-trib rapture which will be followed by the tribulation, then the second coming, next is the first resurrection of the righteous that died in the tribulation, and after that is the judgement of the nations that lived through the tribulation. This judgment takes place in the Valley of Jehoshaphat. Then the millennial reign and the Great White Throne Judgement concluding it all.

These are all false religions. Most of them are a knock off of the Roman Catholic Church. Do you honestly think, that pope, has the Holy Spirit inside of him? I don't.

Notice it said that most religions, the ones they mentioned do not believe in premillennialism. Do you know what that means? It means that they do not believe that Jesus comes back, the Second Coming, just before He physically reigns for 1000 years on this earth. Matt.24:36-42 - But of that day and hour knoweth no *man*, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only. But as the days of Noe *were*, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two *women shall be* grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come.

This passage used to say that the Son of Man does not know the day or the hour either. Only the Father knows and when you understand about Jewish weddings then that passage makes more sense. When the bridegroom had prepared the place for his bride, the father would inspect it to see if it was finished and ready and then he would give his approval and tell the son to go and receive his bride.

There are your left behind people. The end of the tribulation is not a surprise. You can do the math to know when 7 years are up and when Jesus is returning to fight Armageddon. The surprise element is the pre-trib rapture.

In Lacunza's book, *The Coming of Messiah in Glory and Majesty, Vol.1*, he states that at that time, late 19th century, almost all the churches believed Christ's return was after the millennium. He stated this was in error, and he's right, it is.

Pg.22 He says how the church was mad that he dared to say Christ would come again to earth and reign for 1000 years. They thought the church would do the work of bringing in a peaceful millennial reign all by themselves. This stuff is laughable. That is a false doctrine, hasn't happened yet and there will not be total peace until Jesus Christ is ruling and reigning on this earth. Lacunza's book makes it clear that the Roman Catholic Church is not even in agreement with itself. The theologians are not in agreement. Even in the Geneva Bible they have error written in the marginal notes. There is the parable of the King Who prepared a wedding banquet for His Son. That is about God the Father and Jesus and the believers who are the guests and are also the bride.

Matt.24:42-44 - Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.

Jesus telling them to watch so that they are not caught off guard because He's coming like a thief in the night, does not match up with His Second Coming return when every eye shall see Him. There is no surprise there, every eye will see Him

and you can also count down a 7 year tribulation to have a good idea of when He's coming back at the end of it.

As Christians we are to be watching for His return and living obedient lives in the meanwhile so that we are counted worthy to escape all the things that will be coming on the earth.
