# PHARMAKEIA Pt. 2: SORCERERS, WITCHCRAFT, IDOLATRY, DRUGS, HALLUCINOGENS, ENTHEOGENS

#### Thayer's Greek Lexicon

We read this last week so I want to look at C. sorcery, magical arts, often found in connection with idolatry and fostered by it: topically, of the deceptions and seductions of idolatry and they reference Rev. 18:23 which speaks of the nations being deceived by mystery Babylon's sorceries. And last week we learned that the various definitions were about magic, sorcery, witchcraft, druggist, poisoner, spell-giving potion and medication.

The church today is largely unfamiliar with the practices of witchcraft. They referenced many passages from the Old Testament regarding pharmakeia. I looked up those passages in Strong's Hebrew concordance and none of them mentioned drugs or medications at all. In fact, there was not much of a description, it just said sorcery or it would say witchcraft. So it is interesting to me that all of a sudden the Greek definitions are linked to drugs, medicines, poisons or spell-giving potions. The same sorcery referred to in the Old Testament is the same sorcery referred to in the New Testament.

**Exodus 7:11-12** – Then Pharaoh also called the wise men and the sorcerers: now the magicians of Egypt, they also did in like manner with their enchantments. For they cast down every man his rod, and they became serpents: but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods.


The magic performed here by the Egyptian sorcerers is the same type of sorcery mentioned in Revelation. It is paired with idolatry and that means that they practiced magic while interacting with and serving false gods. That means they worshipped and bowed down to the fallen angels. The fallen angels are the gods of Egypt. These wise men, sorcerers, magicians are witches performing witchcraft or sorcery plain and simple.

### 5332 – sorcerer

Cognate: 5332 pharmakeus – a person using drug-based incantations or drugging religious enchantments; a pharmakeus-practitioner who "mixes up distorted religious potions" like a sorcerer-magician. They try to "work their magic" by performing pseudo "supernatural" stunts, weaving illusions about the Christian life to use "powerful" religious formulas ("incantations") that manipulate the Lord into granting more temporal gifts (especially "invincible health and wealth"). This has a "drugging" effect on the aspiring religious zealot, inducing them to think they have "special spiritual powers" (that do not operate in keeping with Scripture).

None of this is Biblical, you cannot manipulate God with potions, spells or incantations. That is witchcraft plain and simple. Now we are beginning to get a better understanding of what pharmakeia actually is. Witchcraft paired with drugs and incantations which are spells.

An **incantation**, a **spell**, a **charm**, an **enchantment**, or a **bewitchery**, is a magical formula intended to trigger a magical effect on a person or objects. The formula can be spoken, sung, or chanted. An incantation can also be performed during ceremonial rituals or prayers. In the world of magic, wizards, witches, and fairies allegedly perform incantations.<sup>[1]</sup>

A witch is a sorcerer, an enchanter, a poisoner etc. The gods the people sought were fallen angels.

## History of drug use in religion

References to the ritual use of drugs are scattered through the history of religions, and there is no doubt that the practice is ancient, its origins lost in prehistory. Presumed ceremonial use of *Cannabis* among the Scythians in the 5th to 2nd century BCE is suggested by the censers for burning hemp seeds found in the frozen tombs at Pazyryk in the <u>Altai Mountains</u>. The ancient <u>Greeks</u> used wine in Dionysian rites, and <u>circumstantial evidence</u> points to the use of a hallucinogenic substance in the most solemn moments of the <u>Eleusinian Mysteries</u> of ancient Greece: the drinking of <u>kykeōn</u>, a thick gruel of unknown <u>composition</u>. Both the <u>secular</u> and the cultic use of the *Amanita muscaria* mushroom in Siberia probably go back more than 6,000 years, and cultic use has spread beyond the cool temperate climates where the mushroom grows. Evidence of the cultic use of <u>opium</u> in the eastern Mediterranean islands, in Greece, and among the Sumerians points to dates as early as 3000 BCE, though some of this evidence is disputed.

One of the pharmacological mysteries is the nature of the Zoroastrian <u>haoma</u> and the early Hindu <u>soma</u>, both sacred drinks made from plants. Their source may have been the <u>Amanita muscaria</u> mushroom, the mind-affecting chemicals of which pass into the urine with their properties very little diminished; there are scriptural references to sacred urine drunk as the source of divine insights. <u>Allusions</u> to the twigs and branches of <u>haoma</u>, however, suggest other plants, perhaps hemp. The mushroom, which does not grow in hot countries, may have been introduced to India by Aryan invaders from the north; subsequently, other plants may have been substituted until their identity was confused and lost.

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The Native American Church has developed into a syncretistic religion, differing from tribe to tribe in minor details and in the degree to which ancient practices have <u>assimilated</u> Christian elements. The ritual surrounding ingestion of peyote is a highly symbolic night-long ceremony in the charge of an experienced Indian. Whites privileged to attend the service invariably speak of its dignity and impressiveness. Peyote itself is highly venerated and spoken of sometimes as a gift of God, sometimes personified as the Peyote Spirit. It is looked on partly as the possessor of magical qualities of protection and healing and the revealer of hidden knowledge, and partly as a guide that motivates and strengthens the worshipper. There is as

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These various drugs were used to have supernatural experiences. Those using them were not seeking God and were not seeking Jesus. They were even using these drugs for protection, healing and to receive hidden knowledge. They were seeking these things from the kingdom of darkness. Even if they attributed what they were doing to seeking God, they were deceived and did not even know His Word.

**Entheogens** are psychoactive substances that induce alterations in perception, mood, consciousness, cognition, or behavior<sup>[1]</sup> for the purposes of engendering spiritual development or otherwise<sup>[2]</sup> in sacred contexts.<sup>[2][3]</sup> The anthropological study has established that entheogens are used for religious, magical, shamanic, or spiritual purposes in many parts of the world. Entheogens have traditionally been used to supplement many diverse practices geared towards achieving transcendence, including divination, meditation, yoga, sensory deprivation, healings, asceticism, prayer, trance, rituals, chanting, imitation of sounds, hymns like peyote songs, drumming, and ecstatic dance.<sup>[not verified in body]</sup> The psychedelic experience is often compared to non-ordinary forms of consciousness such as those experienced in meditation,<sup>[4]</sup> near-death experiences,<sup>[5]</sup> [<sup>not verified in body]</sup> and mystical experiences.<sup>[4]</sup> Ego dissolution is often described as a key feature of the psychedelic experience.<sup>[6]</sup>

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Modern day shaman using drugs in a ritual. He is purposely blowing this hallucinogenic drug, ayahuasca (eye-a-wasca) over this man. This is a modern day witch and he is working to connect this man to the gods which are fallen angels through the use of a hallucinogenic drug and the demons at work in his own life. He is laying his hands on this man in order to transfer demons to him. He will use the drugs and he will say incantations and call on the demons. A shaman or a medicine man are the same as a witch, a sorcerer and an enchanter.

In ancient times, people would go to the poisoner or sorcerer to work their magic in their situation to get what they want. This is the same as going to the witch for her to make potions and cast spells. This is nothing new and has been going on since ancient times.

Most people would not even know the Greek word pharmakeia was in the Bible at all if it weren't for shill truthers. I looked at several different translations on a few key scriptures where the word pharmakeia was used. The Tyndale Bible was written in 1526 and the Geneva New Testament was written in 1557. Let's see what words were used:

So you can see what pharmakeia equates to. It is witchcraft, sorcery and enchantment and according to Strong's definitions, drugs and poisons are involved and it is all tied to idolatry. Seeking to fallen angels or being connected to them by using drugs and poisons or spell-giving potions is what this is all about. Truthers saying the vaccines are the pharmakeia being used to deceive or that prescription or over the counter meds are the sorcery being used to deceive the nations have not considered or studied what that word and passage of Scripture actually means. And furthermore, it is not spelled out completely for us and since we have so much drug interaction in today's world, it makes the interpretation a little unclear as to exactly what it pertains to. I haven't seen the truth about the words sorcerer, witch or enchanter being brought to the forefront by the truthers at all.

There are many different sorceries being practiced on the nations not just Big Pharma drugs and medicines. Scott made me laugh last week when I was discussing this with him. I told him that the deception of modern medicine has been going on for a long time, since way before the vaccines and it is continuing now even after the vaccines.
