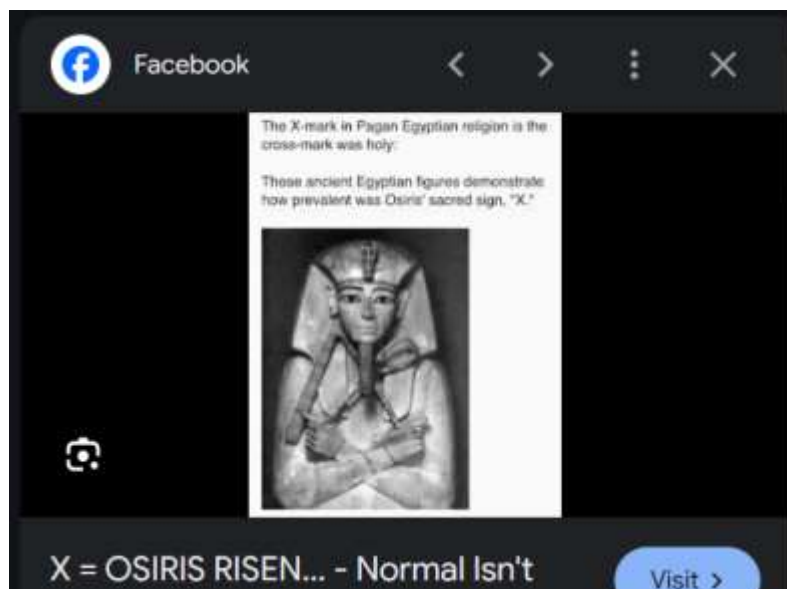


SHOCKING TRUTH ABOUT CHRISTMAS Pt.5: ASHERAH, ISIS, MOTHER of HARLOTS, NIMROD, BABYLON

Last week we learned that satan's false trinity had many names depending on the region and language spoken. We discovered them in our Bibles under the names of Nimrod, baal, asherah and Tammuz. We know one of her titles was the queen of heaven and another was the mother of harlots. They all are an abomination to God.



The x-mark in pagan Egyptian religion is the cross-mark was holy: These ancient Egyptian figures demonstrate how prevalent was osiris' sacred sign, "X." X = Osiris risen. Osiris was supposedly murdered and Isis gathered up all his body parts and did black magic to raise him from the dead. The luciferians always show allegiance to their gods and that is why Elon renamed Twitter to – X.



This is l-r: Babylonian names: Tammuz, Nimrod and Semiramis and in Egypt they were Horus, Osiris and Isis. Osiris seems to be the one highly revered in Freemasonry and Isis worship goes right along with him because she was his wife, mother and sister – just depends on which version of the story you read. They are both revered in Freemasonry by the hi-level freemasons. So they aren't just fables or made up stories. They're in museums, Egyptian tombs, artifacts etc. This false trinity served fallen angels, they were in idolatry against God. That means they were in the occult, so deep in because they were in open rebellion against God building their empire. They practiced witchcraft to the fullest extent.



Isis went in search of Osiris' body parts when he was murdered and then cut in pieces. Osiris is Nimrod in Egypt. She found all the parts except his male body part.



Tammuz is on the left pictured with a bird head and Isis is on the right and Osiris is dead in the middle. He is always shown as a mummy. Isis is depicted in the middle as if watching over or guarding him. The two birds holding him up could be what are called bas that represented the soul in Egyptian religion. Not sure what they are doing here. Isis was known for her dark arts, black magic – witchcraft. She is said to have raised him but he was not considered alive nor dead and that is why he is always wrapped like a mummy. I talked about hoodoo in “Satan’s High Holy Feast Day” sermon series. Those at the deepest levels in the occult can raise someone from the dead. The person will not be right, they will be off, like a zombie or zombified. That kind of power off by satan always requires blood sacrifice. This false trinity did the darkest things imaginable in service and worship of satan in return for demonic power.

Let’s look at a passage of Scripture that mentions her dark arts and talks about those that worship her:

Isaiah 57:1-5 – The righteous perisheth, and no man layeth *it* to heart: and merciful men *are* taken away, none considering that the righteous is taken away from the evil *to come*. He shall enter into peace: they shall rest in their beds, *each one* walking *in* his uprightness. But draw near hither, ye sons of the sorceress, the seed of the adulterer and the whore. Against whom do ye sport yourselves?

against whom make ye a wide mouth, *and* draw out the tongue? *are* ye not children of transgression, a seed of falsehood, Enflaming yourselves with idols under every green tree, slaying the children in the valleys under the cliffs of the rocks?

God goes on in that chapter to reprimand them for their idolatry against Him and tell them how disgusted He is with them. He would judge them and then eventually they would return to Him.

The KJV says sons of "THE" sorceress, not - a - sorceress as other translations say. So this sounds specific to me. She was the queen of the sky and earth, a mother goddess, and called the queen of heaven. She stands in opposition to God and she was key in starting the mystery religions which are of the occult. She was a prostitute, adulterer and a whore in God's eyes because she did not love, serve and obey Him but instead, was just like Nimrod, prideful and drawing people away from God demanding them to worship her instead. She worshiped satan and the fallen angels and sought worship for herself. She cheated on God spiritually in every way and those that follow her ways, are who God was talking to in that passage, which was Israel at that time. They were worshiping under the green trees just like she told their worshipers to do. We know the worshipers of Nimrod were murdering their children in sacrifice to him because he was baal and bel and molech in our Bibles.

Jeremiah 19:5 - They have built also the high places of Baal, to burn their sons with fire *for* burnt offerings unto Baal, which I commanded not, nor spake *it*, neither came *it* into My mind:

God has always been appalled by what the pagans did and forbid His children to have anything to do with what they did.

Through her scheming and designing, Semiramis became the Babylonian "Queen of Heaven," and Nimrod, under various names, became the "divine son of heaven."

Jer.7:18-20 – The children gather wood, and the fathers kindle the fire, and the women knead their dough, to make cakes to the **queen of heaven**, and to pour out drink offerings to other gods, that they may provoke Me to anger. Do they provoke Me to anger? Says the LORD: do they not provoke themselves to the

confusion of their own faces? Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, mine anger and my fury shall be poured out upon this place, upon man, and upon beast, and upon the trees of the field, and upon the fruit of the ground; and it shall burn, and shall not be quenched.

Last week we read the passage where the women were saying their men were also part of the worship to her, they had full knowledge. This passage shows that the whole family was engaged in worship to the queen of heaven. The children gathered the wood for the fire and the fathers tended to the fire and the women made the dough for the cakes they were making in worship of the queen of heaven. All of this made God angry with them. He ended by saying that they did it to themselves because He was going to pour His wrath out on them.

Through the generations, in this idolatrous worship, Nimrod became the false Messiah, son of Baal the Sun-god.



In this *Babylonish* system of worship, the "Mother and Child," (Semiramis and Nimrod reborn), became chief objects of worship. This worship of "Mother and Child" spread over the world. The names varied in different countries and languages. In Egypt, it was Isis and Osiris. In Asia, Cybele and Attis. In Pagan Rome, Fortuna and Jupiter. Even in Greece, China, Japan, Tibet is to be found the counterpart of the Madonna, *long before the birth of Christ!*

There are plenty of carvings, pictures, statues and artifacts of semiramis and tammuz. Many times they will have a round disk around their heads indicating sun worship. Nimrod loved masonry and is linked with freemasonry. In

freemasonry he is revered as Osiris and Osiris is the same as Hiram Abiff. I brought that out in the teaching series entitled "Freemasonry".



The Statue of Liberty was given to us by the French masons who are illuminati. She is positioned facing the east – Easter being one of her names. She brings the spirit of Jezebel over this nation.



This is another representation of her, the Columbia Pictures lady. She's holding up a torch and the sun symbolism is accentuated above her head. This idolatry began in ancient times against God has continued right through to today. Those at hi-levels know full well who this is.

Cybele/Rhea/Semiramis is the "tower bearing goddess" and you will see many pictures of her with a tower type of crown on her head.



Notice the tower on her head. On the left they call her Diana of Ephesus. She is the same as Semiramis or Isis. You always see many breasts on her or bull testicles which symbolize that she is a fertility goddess. You could also say she is considered "mother nature" – queen of the sky and earth. She has all the animals on her also symbolizing fertility.



This fountain of Diana, Artemis, Semiramis is in Tivoli, Italy. Her images are still standing all over this world today.

themselves at a loss to determine. In the records of antiquity the existence of any *god* of fortifications has been commonly overlooked; and it must be confessed that no such god stands forth there with any prominence to the ordinary reader. But of the existence of a *goddess* of fortifications, every one knows that there is the amplest evidence. That goddess is Cybele, who is universally represented with a mural or turreted crown, or with a fortification, on her head. Why was Rhea or Cybele thus represented? Ovid asks the question and answers it himself, and the answer is this: The reason he says, why the statue of Cybele wore a crown of towers was, "because she first erected them in cities." The first city in the world after the flood (from whence the commencement of the world itself was often dated) that had towers and encompassing walls, was Babylon; and Ovid himself tells us that it was Semiramis, the first queen of that city, who was believed to have "surrounded Babylon with a wall of brick." Semiramis, then, the first deified queen of that city and tower whose top was intended to reach to heaven, must have been the prototype of the goddess who "*first made towers in cities.*" When we look at the Ephesian Diana, we find evidence to the very same effect. In general, Diana was depicted as a virgin, and the patroness of virginity; but the Ephesian Diana was quite different. She was represented with all the attributes of the Mother of the gods ([see Figure 8](#)), and, as the Mother of the gods, she wore a turreted crown, such as no one can contemplate without being forcibly reminded of the tower of Babel. Now this tower-bearing Diana is by an ancient scholiast expressly identified with Semiramis."


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era was Diana, or Artemis, shown here with her many breasts, which were thought to provide succor for those who were born through her gift of fertility.

These gods and goddesses are the fruits of misguided human minds, which searched for meaning in the elementary forces of life. But real meaning and purpose are found only in the one true God and his Son Jesus Christ.

Listed below are other prominent pagan gods mentioned in the Old and New Testaments:



Diana, or Artemis, was a fertility goddess of the New Testament era.


Molech – Ammonite god; connected with child sacrifice. – Leviticus 18:21

Out of those listed here, at least 8 out of 10 point directly to satan's first false trinity. It's important for us to know who they were and what they did because God is against this idolatrous worship system that they started. These are the false gods who were worshiped at winter solstice festivals which were later renamed Christmas by the Roman Catholic Church. All the things that are part of Christmas came from them from ancient Babylon and Egyptian practices.



11:1-9 Josephus, the Jewish historian, places Babel in the days of Nimrod. Babel was a pointed rejection of God's instruction to "replenish the earth" (Gen. 9:1). It was a flagrant example of the corporate pride and willfulness of man. The intent of the tower may not have been to reach heaven; the expression can refer to a tower with an idolatrous "temple for heaven" on its top.

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At any rate the tower ties directly to Nimrod and his mother and wife who was often depicted with a tower on her head as a crown. They were prideful in their rebellion against God.



This is the original Starbucks maiden turned upside down. Semiramis was called the goddess of the sea. Looking at it upside down, her two fish tails make the horns of the baphomet or pan which is satan, the god she served. He seems to have a goofy face here but you can easily see him. Her images and worship system have lasted through the ages.

Revelation 18:1-8 – And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory. And he cried mightily with a strong voice, saying, Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird. For all nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, and the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her, and the merchants of the earth are waxed rich through the abundance of her delicacies. And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues. For her sins have reached unto heaven, and God hath remembered her iniquities. Reward her even as she rewarded you, and double unto her double according to her works: in the cup which she hath filled fill to her double. How much she hath glorified herself, and lived deliciously, so much torment and sorrow give her: for she saith in her heart, I sit a queen, and am no widow, and shall see no sorrow. Therefore shall her plagues come in one day, death, and

mourning, and famine; and she shall be utterly burned with fire: for strong *is* the Lord God who judgeth her.

The nations, drinking of the wine of the wrath of her fornication. This phrase suggests a widespread influence of corruption and moral decay, symbolized by "wine," which often represents seduction and intoxication in biblical literature. The "nations" indicate a global impact, suggesting that the immorality of Babylon (often interpreted as a symbol of a corrupt world system) has permeated every corner of the earth. This imagery echoes Jeremiah 51:7, where Babylon is described as a golden cup that made the earth drunk. The "passion of her immorality" implies a fervent, almost irresistible allure that leads to spiritual and moral compromise. This can be seen as a warning against the seductive power of sin and the consequences of turning away from God's commandments.

The world leaders are in this system of worship, they are in mystery Babylon spiritually against God.

so that you will not share in her sins

The warning to avoid sharing in her sins highlights the danger of complicity and moral contamination. This echoes the biblical principle of being in the world but not of it ([John 17:14-16](#)). The call to holiness and separation from sin is a recurring theme throughout Scripture, urging believers to live distinctively ([2 Corinthians 6:17](#)).

or contract any of her plagues.

The mention of plagues draws a parallel to the plagues of Egypt (Exodus 7-11), symbolizing divine judgment. It serves as a warning of the consequences of remaining aligned with a sinful system. The plagues in Revelation are part of the eschatological judgments, emphasizing the severity of God's wrath against sin and the protection offered to those who heed His call to separate.

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CLOSING

God is calling us out of the spiritual mystery Babylon and mystery Egypt religions that Nimrod and his wife and mother, the queen of heaven started. He wants us not to have anything to do with the gods they worshiped and all the things they did in worship to them. All the greenery and evergreen trees, gift giving, singing, lights etc. at Christmastime came from them. Their winter feasts included fertility rituals, sacrifices, drunkenness, revelry and all sorts of sexual immorality.

In the passage of Scripture we just read, she says that she sits as a queen and is no widow. To me that can have a double meaning. One is that it is the city of Babylon as you can also see in Isaiah Ch. 47. Two, is that it's Semiramis herself, saying she is forever a queen and will never be considered a widow. She managed to get pregnant and create a story about Nimrod becoming the sun god, with the full grown evergreen tree springing forth from a dead tree stump overnight which deified him in death and herself and the baby she was carrying. She certainly did not consider herself to be a widow. She said she would not have any grief. She managed to hang on to her position and power and continued to rule and be worshiped. When Nimrod was murdered, she reinvented herself and gained even more power. She was a witch, as the Bible calls her a sorceress in every since of the word. Conjuring, working spells and curses, shapeshifting etc. fully possessed and empowered by the fallen angels.
